Housed in a three-story, \$16 million building called the Miramar Library and Education Center, the 31,000square-foot library takes up the first floor, Broward College is on the second floor and Nova Southeastern University on the third.

ing a first-class city be a meeting place to share ideas and a place for South Broward residents to come together and celebrate cultures. . . . Nova and Broward College make the whole package complete," Mayor Lori Moseley said.

So far, 60,000 books line shelves and 79 computers are available for public use.

Children's Librarian Carmen Wonsang of Miramar said programs for children will begin with Toddler Time from II to II:30 a.m. Nov. 3.
